

# *Selling Out For The Kingdom*

Matthew 13:44-46

Big Idea: Sell out for the Kingdom, but more importantly, sell out for the King. Are we willing to deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow Jesus? Let's inventory our lives, put everything on the altar, and ask God what He wants us to relinquish. Live in a way that demands a gospel answer.

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## Key Takeaways:

1. True faith requires selling out for both the kingdom of heaven and the King (God).
2. Christians are called to deny themselves, take up their cross, and follow Jesus - this is not an easy path.
3. Our good works should cause others to glorify God and potentially demand a "gospel answer."

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## Discussion Questions:

What stood out to you most from the sermon? Why?

How would you explain the difference between the two parables Jesus tells in Matthew 13:44-46?

The speaker says many people want the "kingdom" (benefits) without the "king" (relationship with God). Have you observed this tendency in yourself or others? Explain.

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How does the idea of "selling out" for God challenge your current approach to faith?

The speaker mentions historical Christians who made extreme sacrifices for the gospel. How do their examples inspire or challenge you?

What are some ways our church community could have a more noticeable positive impact on our local area?

How do you respond to the challenge to "do an inventory" of what you value and offer it to God? What areas might be difficult to surrender?

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#### Practical Applications:

1. This week, conduct a personal inventory of your values, possessions, time, goals, and relationships. Prayerfully consider what God may be asking you to "sell out" or reprioritize.
2. Identify one tangible way you can serve others in your community this month that reflects Christ's love and may open doors for sharing the gospel.
3. Reflect on your motivations for following Christ. Are you seeking the "kingdom" (benefits) more than the "king" (relationship with God)? Journal about how you can cultivate a deeper desire for God Himself.
4. As a group, brainstorm ways your small group or church could have a more noticeable positive impact in your local community. Choose one idea to implement together.

#### Closing Thought/Prayer:

Take time to pray, asking God to help us be a people who don't just believe the truth, but live it out radically - denying ourselves, taking up our cross, and following Jesus with everything we have.

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
