2 Peter 2:10-22

Big Idea: Truth matters. False teachers lead many astray with deception and pride. Only fools believe they can live without consequences. God's Word warns us to test spirits, stay humble, and cling to Christ. Don't be fooled—know Jesus truly. Our fruit reveals our faith.

Opening Question:

Can you share an instance where you've encountered 'mission drift' in your personal life or in an organization, and how did you address it to realign with your core values or mission?

Discussion Questions:

Pastor Tim mentioned the mission drift of Harvard University. How can we as individuals and as a church guard against drifting away from our core beliefs and values?

The sermon emphasized the importance of humility, especially when dealing with spiritual matters. How can we cultivate humility in our daily lives and in our approach to Scripture?

Peter warns about false teachers who "openly embrace their sin and encourage others to do the same." How do you see this happening in our current culture? How can we lovingly stand for truth without compromising?

Discuss the story of Balaam (Numbers 22-24). What lessons can we learn from his example about the dangers of compromise and greed?

The sermon mentions that some people may be deceived into thinking they know Jesus when they don't. How can we ensure that our faith is genuine and not just superficial?

Pastor Tim referenced 1 John 4:1-6 about testing the spirits. How can we practically apply this in our daily lives to discern truth from error?

Practical Applications:

1. Commit to regular Bible study and prayer to stay grounded in God's truth.
2. Practice humility by actively listening to others and being open to correction.
3. Identify areas in your life where you might be compromising biblical truth and take steps to align with God's Word.
4. Seek accountability from trusted believers to help you stay on the right path.
5. Be intentional about examining the fruit of your faith (Matthew 7:15-20) to ensure your relationship with Christ is genuine.

Closing Thought/Prayer:

Close by praying for discernment, protection from false teaching, and a deeper commitment to following Christ and His truth.
