I've had to let go of so many things this year. Expectations, belongings, and friends. I've leaned into pieces of myself that have been silent for a long time and seen new facets of the Good News glimmering.

This year has been particularly shifting for John. He is back in his element: new place, new language, new relationships, new challenges to overcome. But this year he has learned so much about himself and the gifts and strengths God has given him. He has become more patient, more kind, more gentle. More willing to listen, and to share his vulnerabilities. For a guy who likes to DO, the waiting has been particularly frustrating, but he has come out on the other side more resilient.

When we met a team in February to formulate our vision, I brought a drawing of what I hopped to see happen in this city. In a city filled with pavement and cement apartment buildings, it is rare to find green space. Occasionally you will find a tree, a weed, a flower, or a vine growing in a small patch of dirt. Life clinging on in a barren place. This was vision I brought to the work we are doing. In a (metaphorical) city of cement hearts, may life spring from the tiniest cracks, growing into lush vines of hope.

In our area of the city, there is massive renovation happening everywhere. On every street there are buildings torn down, no longer deemed safe for habitation. Our local city has proposed a massive undertaking to tear down many of the buildings in our suburb and rebuild them over the next several years (don't worry the home we bought happens to be brand new). But as the buildings are being torn down, it is revealing tiny alcoves of life in hidden courtyards between houses. Life in the shadows. On my walk home from school last week, I saw one of the green oasis's, revealed when a dangerous building was torn down. My heart was encouraged. The HS whispered o my heart "pray that hearts would be like these plants. As security is shaken, pray that the strongholds, like the buildings, would come down, making way for Light and Growth in hearts longing for light."
