LOVE MORE AND MORE

Studies in 1 & 2 Thessalonians

1 Thessalonians 4:9, NIV

Now about your love for one another we do not need to write to you, for you yourselves have been taught by God to love each other.

1 Thessalonians 4:10, NIV

And in fact, you do love all of God's family throughout Macedonia. Yet we urge you, brothers and sisters, to do so more and more,

1 Thessalonians 4:11, NIV

and to make it your ambition to lead a quiet life: You should mind your own business and work with your hands, just as we told you,

1 Thessalonians 4:11, NIV

so that your daily life may win the respect of outsiders and so that you will not be dependent on anybody.

Two parallel ideas in 1 Th 4:9-12

- Love abounds when sharing with those really in need.
- Love abounds when working to meet my own needs.

1 Thessalonians 4:1, NIV

We instructed you how to live in order to **please God**, as in fact you are living. Now we ask you and urge you in the Lord Jesus to **do this more and more**.

Love abounds when sharing with those really in need

- Paul knew of specific instances of acts of love by the Thessalonians.
 - "We have no need to write to you" is both commendation and stimulation.
 - You've made a great start! Don't stop now!

Love abounds when sharing with those really in need

- How did God teach them to love each other?
 - The work of the Holy Spirit.
 - The preaching of the apostles who taught them the words of Jesus (God the Son).
 - The OT was opened to them by the Spirit.

Love abounds when working to meet my own needs

- Love is an action I take to meet the real needs of another.
 - People need more than a handout.
 - They need a way to support themselves.
 - They need a way to share with those in need (see Eph 4:28).

Love abounds when working to meet my own needs

- The patronage problem of the 1st Century was a trap for believers.
 - Patron/client relationship meant giving up freedom. No man can serve two masters.
 - Freedom and self-sufficiency were highly valued in the Greek world of Thessalonica.

Love abounds when working to meet my own needs

- Love refuses to take advantage of the generosity of others.
 - Industry and hard work always adorn the gospel message.
 - Work! Find projects to complete, neighbors to help, skills to learn, people to enlist in helping others.
