Karen Foster in Cameroon

"It is not rare to lose a child here," I wrote a year ago, after a Sunday school girl in a nearby church died of illness. Africa is known for large families and for orphans, and we're not the exception here in Yaounde. That God comforts and provides for kids, and especially that their faith grows or they come to know him as they experience loss.

Brothers Fabien and Fleuri of the local "football" boys lost their father to illness last month and were whisked off to another town with relatives. Thankfully, they'd been with that family last year for school vacation. Mom had already left dad. I bought them a "football" to take along, not realizing they were already gone. It will not go to waste.

This month it's John's five kids, ages 3 to 13, who are orphaned. We use the term "orphan" when either parent dies. John apparently died of a strangled hernia. They're pictured below, exactly two years ago. On the right is Marie, who was with them for a cou-

ple years until her dad turned up. He had gone missing during the war in the C.A.R. and was presumed dead. John worked at my house for over 10 years but was let go last year before I went to the U.S. because of his long-standing tendency to disappear when he was supposed to be guarding my house. I know the kids better than any others in Cameroon.



Coworker Jacquie and I were able to visit the home. The kids, a 14-year-old niece who's been with them, an uncle and I went out to lunch one day last week. They're brave little folks and were obviously well taken care of by dad. Five-year-old Melanie is still a vivacious hugging hand-holder. Seven-year-old Sarah is still shy, but not too shy to ask for strawberry ice cream after lunch! Next time; they'd had plenty of soda pop. Mom is around but left the family a couple years ago. She apparently hasn't remarried and the hope is that she will take care of the kids for the rest of the school year (will there be a rest of the school year??) and then they'll probably be scattered among relatives. Who can take in five together?


