

A foundational truth to reframe your life

God wants you to be with him forever because God loves you.

1 Thessalonians 4:13, NIV

¹³ Brothers and sisters, we do not want you to be uninformed about those who sleep in death, so that you do not grieve like the rest of mankind, who have no hope.

1 Thessalonians 4:14, NIV

¹⁴ For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him.

1 Thessalonians 4:15, NIV

¹⁵ According to the Lord's word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep.

1 Thessalonians 4:16, NIV

¹⁶ For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first.

1 Thessalonians 4:17, NIV

- 3. Hope is as wonderful as our words are full.

Hope is as sound as where it is found

Paul's personal story was reframed by an encounter with the resurrected Jesus on Damascus Road.


Objective truth = Jesus died & rose. Personal investment = we believe.

To hope more and more

Look where hope is found.

Hope is as strong as those who belong

Two critical words:

- In + Christ
- God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him —who have fallen asleep in Christ.

Hope is as strong as those who belong

As surely as Jesus was raised to new life never to die again—we must be raised to life again and be with Christ.

Why? Our union with Christ requires it.

Hope is as strong as those who belong

The intensity of our emotions can drown out the messages of our believe system.

Confront emotional realities with spiritual realities.

- The dignitary, governor, emperor would stop outside your city.
- City officials in their finest would go out to meet this one and be honored to escort him/her into your city.
- "To meet" -- 1 Th 4:17; Acts 28:15; Mt 25:6

Is your hope merely a wish?

- Or is your hope based on divinely promised, sovereignly planned certainties?
- What words encourage?

Use words loaded with the certainty of this hope.


We will be with the Lord forever.

Start each day with fresh commitment:

Dear God, I choose to hope more and more—today. Help me!

Teach me the gospel's power in the One who died for sinners and lives to give them hope unshakeable.

I hope you can find some consolation from Christianity's affirmation that death is not the end. Death is not a period that ends the great sentence of life, but a comma that punctuates it to more lofty significance.



Death is not a blind alley that leads the human race into a state of nothingness, but an open door which leads man into life eternal. Let this daring faith, the great invincible surmise, be your sustaining power during these trying days.
