Cana Silvers

Cana scampered down the stairs and careened into her dad, giving him a tight hug. Laughing, he squeezed her back before pulling a small package from his duffel. Cana's eyes sparkled as she removed the embroidered cloth from the brown envelope.

With her military dad often away on international travel, Cana always loved when he would bring home objects and postcards from far away places. As she ran her fingers over the agricultural scene's raised threads, she contemplated the people stitched into the fabric. What were their lives like? What did they eat? Did they have enough money? Had they ever heard about Jesus?

This early exposure to other cultures progressed into learning how to share the gospel at a summer missions camp. Gradually, Cana's heart was being stirred toward the Great Commission. As she grew older, the call intensified. In college, she pursued several evangelistic opportunities, including a trip to Okinawa and outreach to Mormons in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Like many students completing college, Cana doesn't yet know what God has planned for her future. She does know that she wants to participate in the Great Commission, and she is ready to go wherever God calls her. That's what excites her most about spending a semester with Encompass serving Muslims in Central Asia. She will see how God uses this unique set of experiences to continue forming the calling on her life.

Stepping into young adulthood can be overwhelming. But Cana's example of readiness demonstrates that it is safe to trust God with the future, to simply say, like the prophet Isaiah, "Here I am, send me." (Isaiah 6:8) When we approach our Creator with our desire to participate in His story, we can trust that He will lead in His time.

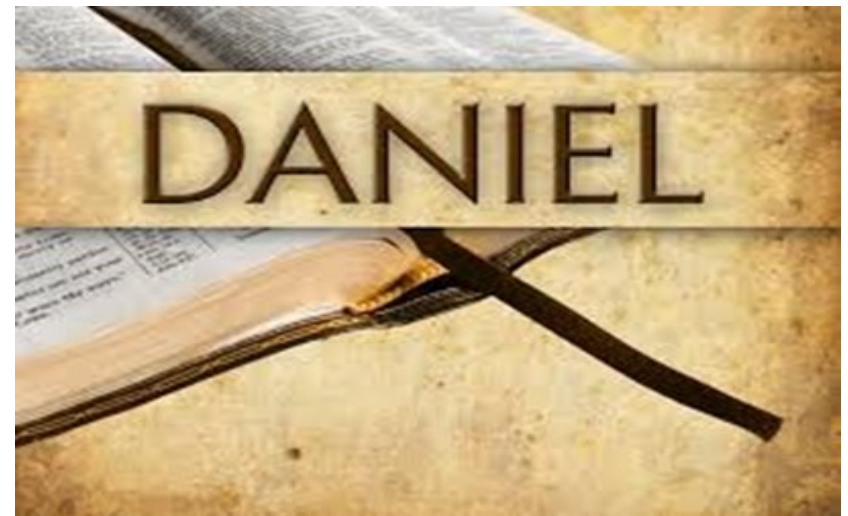

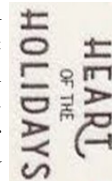
